2 hrs. 23 min (110.3 mi) via I-684 N and I-84 E

6. Metro North from Grand Central Station in NYC

Cost \$17-36. Time approx. 2 and 1/2 hrs. to 3 hrs. depending on time of departure

In some cases you have to go from NYC to NEW HAVEN and then get yourself to HAMDEN which borders it. **NOTE: Pennsylvania Station is not the same as Grand Central Terminal.** That is why they have different names... Pennsylvania Station is on Seventh Avenue, between 33rd and 31st Streets. It was built as the station in New York City for the Pennsylvania Railroad.
